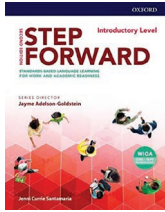




ESL Course Descriptions

Below are course descriptions for the ESL classes and the books used at each level. Textbook sets can be purchased in the school office. Textbook sets include a student book and a workbook.

Textbook purchase is optional.



Literacy

Textbook: Step Forward Introductory

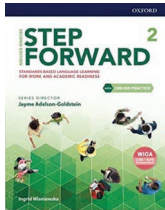
This course is for students who have little or no literacy skills in English and/or their first language. Students practice writing the alphabet, making words and sentences, and expressing themselves in simple English. Students learn to communicate in English using questions and answers. Students build basic communication skills that enable them to participate in daily activities.



Beginning Low

Textbook: Step Forward 1

This course is for students who are beginning to build their language skills in English. Students practice communication skills for everyday situations and build a larger vocabulary through listening, speaking, reading, writing and grammar activities. Students communicate using basic words and phrases. Students understand and respond to some phrases when spoken slowly and with much repetition.



Beginning High

Textbook: Step Forward 2

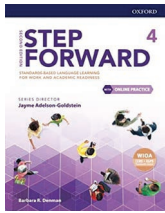
This course is for students who have basic language abilities. Students gain additional language skills needed for basic communication at home, school, and work. This includes listening, speaking, pronunciation, reading, grammar, and writing skills. Students write several basic sentences about personal topics with grammatical accuracy.



Intermediate Low

Textbook: Step Forward 3

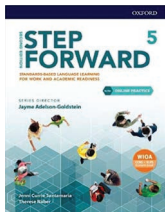
This course is for students to continue developing their communicative abilities through listening, speaking, reading, writing and grammar activities. This class focuses on increasing reading skills and strategies with an intensive emphasis on vocabulary development. Students will practice new vocabulary in writing and will engage in role-play activities in routine social and work settings.



Intermediate High

Textbook: Step Forward 4

This course is for students who have mastered many literacy skills. Students further develop their language skills in order to enhance their personal, social, and workplace communication. Students focus on developing listening for phrases and new vocabulary in unfamiliar settings. Students start building academic vocabulary and strategies.



Advanced

Textbook: Step Forward 5

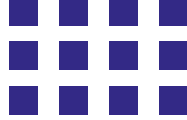
This course is for students to develop academic skills and vocabulary through activities that include team projects and presentations. Students develop high level critical thinking and problem solving while increasing their command of language strategies. Students recognize main ideas and details in conversations and short lectures. The course will broaden students' ability to comprehend and use spoken English in a variety of social situations. ***Does not include workbook.**

Citizenship Preparation

These free courses provide English language learners the information and skills they need to complete the naturalization process. Participants practice listening, speaking, reading, and writing skills through content and activities that focus on learning about U.S. history, government, culture, institutions, and the rights and responsibilities of citizenship. Using resources available from USCIS, participants practice skills for the naturalization interview and for completing the N-400 application.

PARENT EDUCATION THROUGH PARENT/CHILD PARTICIPATION (PARENT & ME)

This class is designed for parents and/or guardians to participate with their child in an observational preschool setting. Parents and children will participate in group activities, attend field trips, and participate in group discussions to stimulate social and emotional growth and foster school readiness. Activities include sharing the letter of the week, learning the ABCs and their sounds, learning colors, flag salute, calendar, days of the week, craft time using many different art mediums, circle time, singing, dancing, outside play, snack time, tabletop activities and end the day with puppet time!

Requirements for Enrollment: Parents must bring proof of child's current immunizations: Polio, DTP or DTaP, MMR, Hepatitis B, Hib and Varicella. **Parents must have a current tuberculosis clearance.**



REGISTRATION: A non-refundable \$150 registration fee per class session. A non-refundable \$45 fee for each additional child. Upon registration, parents **MUST HAVE** proof of TB clearance. You will not be able to register without proof of TB clearance.

Community Education Registration is Easy. Enroll Early!

Community Education classes do not receive any state funds, students pay a class fee sufficient to cover the direct costs of instruction. The class fee is based upon a minimum enrollment of eight students unless otherwise noted, and varies according to the number of hours of instruction. Classes which do not meet the minimum attendance number by the end of the first hour of the first class meeting will be able to choose from one of the following options in order to maintain the class:

1. Pay higher class fees to cover the cost of the class based on the minimum enrollment.
2. Reduce the total hours of instruction to cover the direct costs of instruction.
3. Cancel the class.

Enrollments are taken in the order received, and some courses will fill quickly. Early enrollment is strongly advised. You are enrolled in the activity/class of your choice unless you are notified of a change or a problem. 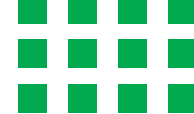

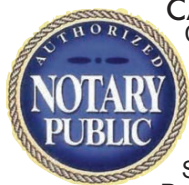

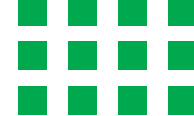

Parents, Guardians, Pupils, and Teachers:

Pursuant to California Education Code 35186, you are hereby notified that:

1. There should be sufficient textbooks and instructional materials. That means each pupil, including English learners, must have a textbook or instructional materials, or both, to use in class and to take home.
2. School facilities must be clean, safe, and maintained in good repair.
There should be no teacher vacancies or misassignments. There should be a teacher assigned to each class and not a series of substitutes or other temporary teachers. The teacher should have the proper credential to teach the class, including the certification required to teach English learners, if present.
Teacher vacancy means a position to which a single designated certificated employee has not been assigned at the beginning of the year for an entire year or, if the position is for a one-semester course, a position to which a single designated certificated employee has not been assigned at the beginning of a semester for an entire semester.
3. Misassignment means the placement of a certificated employee in a teaching or services position for which the employee does not hold a legally recognized certificate or credential or the placement of a certificated employee in a teaching or services position that the employee is not otherwise authorized by statute to hold.

UNIFORM COMPLAINT PROCEDURE (UCP) ANNUAL NOTICE COMMUNITY RELATIONS BP 1312.3(A)

The Governing Board recognizes that the district has the primary responsibility to ensure compliance with applicable state and federal laws and regulations governing educational programs. The Board encourages early resolution of complaints whenever possible. 6. Child care and development programs
7. Compensatory education
8. Consolidated categorical aid programs)
9. Course periods without educational content, when students in grades 9-12 are assigned to such courses more than one week in any semester or in a course the student has previously satisfactorily completed, unless specified conditions are met
10. Discrimination, harassment, intimidation, or bullying in district programs and activities, including in those programs or activities funded directly by or that receive or benefit from any state financial assistance, based on the person's actual or perceived characteristics of race or ethnicity, color, ancestry, nationality, national origin, immigration status, ethnic group identification, age, religion, marital status, pregnancy, parental status, physical or mental disability, medical condition, sex,

sexual orientation, gender, gender identity, gender expression, or genetic information, or any other characteristic identified in Education Code 200 or 220, Government Code 11135, or Penal Code 422.55, or based on the person's association with a person or group with one or more of these actual or perceived characteristics (5 CCR 4610)

11. Educational and graduation requirements for students in foster care, homeless students, students from military families, students formerly in a juvenile court school, migrant students, and immigrant students participating in a newcomer program
12. Every Student Succeeds Act
13. Local control and accountability plan
14. Migrant education

18. Regional occupational centers and program

24. Any complaint alleging retaliation against a complainant or other participant in the complaint process or anyone who has acted to uncover or report a violation subject to this policy
25. Any other state or federal educational program the Superintendent of Public Instruction or designee deems appropriate

The Board recognizes that alternative dispute resolution (ADR) can, depending on the nature of the allegations, offer a process for resolving a complaint in a manner that is acceptable to all parties. An ADR process such as mediation may be offered to resolve complaints that involve more than one student and no adult. However, mediation shall not be offered or used to resolve any complaint involving sexual assault or where there is a reasonable risk that a party to the mediation would feel compelled to participate. The Superintendent or designee shall ensure that the use of ADR is consistent with state and federal laws and regulations.

The district shall protect all complainants from retaliation. In investigating complaints, the confidentiality of the parties involved shall be protected as required by law. For any complaint alleging retaliation or unlawful discrimination (such as discriminatory harassment, intimidation, or bullying), the Superintendent or designee shall keep the identity of the complainant, and/or the subject of the complaint if different from the complainant, confidential when appropriate and as long as the integrity of the complaint process is maintained.

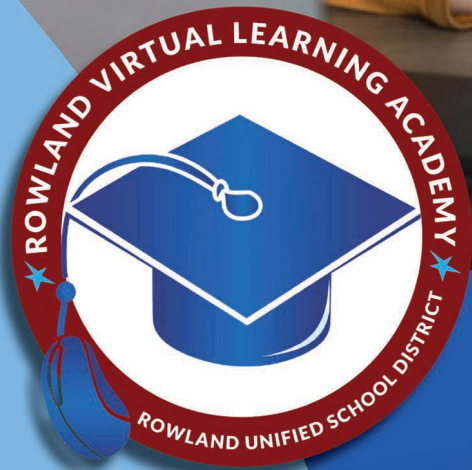

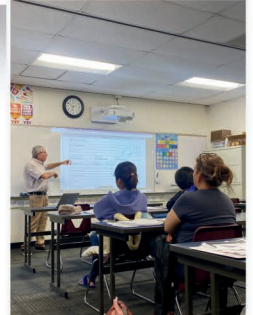

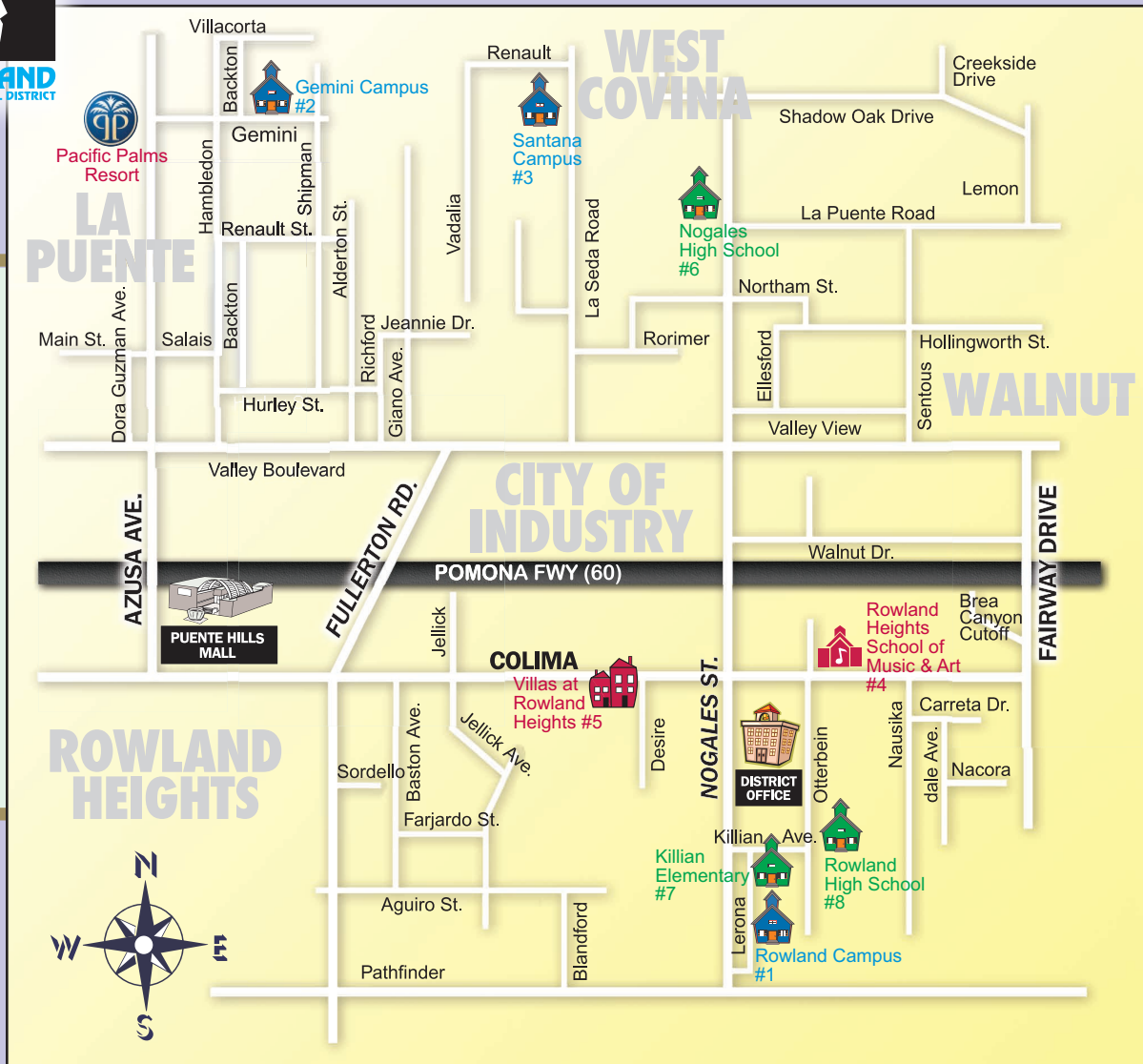
